Forward Planning Section Report To The New Schools Establishment Group New Post-Primary Schools 2015/2016

Location: Celbridge, Co. Kildare (map attached)

Year Required: 2015

School Size required: Long term projected need up to 1000.

Medium of Instruction: English

Applications Received

Three applications were received to establish the new post-primary school in Celbridge. A brief profile of each applicant together with a synopsis of the school type proposed is set out hereunder:

Educate Together

Educate Together is the representative organisation of the 58 Educate Together National Schools throughout the Country, and it is patron of 45 of these schools. Educate Together is advanced in its plans to open its first second-level school in Hansfield, Dublin 15 in 2014. In addition, Educate Together is involved in a co-patronage model with Louth & Meath Education and Training Board in a community school to open in Drogheda, Co. Louth in 2014, and in a partnership model with Dublin & Dun Laoghaire Education and Training Board in a community college in Clonburris, Lucan, Co. Dublin, also opening in 2014. A Blueprint for Educate Together's second-level schools has been developed called "Taking the Next Steps". The organisation became a company limited by guarantee in 1998 and has charitable status.

School type proposed:

Multi-denominational, co-educational post-primary school.

Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board

Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board (KWETB) is a new entity, established on July 1st 2013 through the amalgamation of County Kildare VEC and County Wicklow VEC. KWETB is patron of twenty post-primary schools, with a student population of 11,121. The post-primary schools have a variety of governance structures reflecting the communities served by the schools including non-designated community colleges and designated community colleges. KWETB is joint patron of 5 community schools in its administrative area. Kildare and Wicklow ETB also manages a Community National School in Naas, Co. Kildare.

School type proposed:

Non-designated, multi-denominational, co-educational community college.

Educate Together and Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board

The third application is a joint application from Educate Together and the Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board. Both patrons have had discussions to explore the potential benefits that a joint application might bring to the communities of Kildare and Wicklow as well as post-primary education in Ireland generally. Initial discussions have established that there are many similarities between the type of school proposed by both patrons as both share many educational aims and objectives. Both patrons are currently engaged in a process of exploration and discussion as to whether community schools under the joint patronage of the two organisations would best meet the needs of parents in these two areas.

Both patrons have asked that, given the positive engagement they have had to date and, without prejudice to the conclusion of their current discussions, the Department would consider the possibility of awarding them the joint patronage of this school. They understand that any such arrangement would require the positive conclusion of their current joint discussions and more importantly, the approval of parents who had expressed interest in one or other patron. It has been stated that, should they reach agreement, the prospective patrons would consult with parents with a view to securing their support for a joint patronage model.

School type proposed:

This has yet to be agreed between the parties, however, if an Educational and Training Board is to form a partnership with a national patron body, such as Educate Together, the resulting model is required to be of a community school type.

Demographic details

There are two post-primary schools in the Celbridge feeder area with an overall enrolment in 2012/2013 school year of 1,463 pupils. The schools comprise an all-boys school with an enrolment of 699 pupils and an all-girls school with an enrolment of 764 pupils.

Enrolments for the feeder area are projected to grow to approximately 2,334 pupils up to the year 2023 based on a 100% intake into schools in the feeder area.

This is a potential 871 extra pupils.

The current rate of intake at Post-Primary level is 91%. Based on this rate of intake enrolment is expected to grow to approximately 2,127 pupils up to the year 2023. **This is a potential 664 extra pupils.**

2. Multiple Provider Areas - Criteria for deciding on patronage where there is currently at least one second level school

Will the establishment of the proposed school result in greater diversity and plurality of second level school patronage and provision in the area (having regard to neighbouring areas) where there is demand for such diversity and plurality. In this context individual patron bodies from the one faith group will be regarded as representing the same school patronage type for assessing plurality.

There are currently two post-primary providers in Celbridge, an all-boys school with a Catholic ethos and an all-girls interdenominational community school with a Catholic ethos.

Educate Together proposal: multi denominational, co-educational post primary school

Given that all post-primary provision in the feeder area currently has a Catholic ethos, the establishment of a multi-denominational, non-designated community college will provide diversity at post-primary level in the area.

Kildare and Wicklow ETB proposal: non designated community college.

Given that all post-primary provision in the feeder area currently has a Catholic ethos, the establishment of a multi-denominational, non-designated community college will provide diversity at post-primary level in the area.

Educate Together and Kildare and Wicklow ETB Joint Proposal:

The joint model proposed by the patrons will be of a community school type. Given that all post-primary providers in the feeder area currently have a Catholic ethos, the joint model proposed would result in greater diversity and plurality of second level patronage in the feeder area.

Neighbouring feeder areas:

Celbridge has 7 neighbouring feeder areas with 18 existing post-primary schools. 3 additional post-primary schools are due to open in 2014.

- 12 schools, 1 of which is fee-charging, have a Catholic ethos
- 9 schools have a multi-denominational ethos (3 of these are due to open in 2014, 1 in Maynooth and 1 in Naas. Both of these new schools will be under the patronage of Kildare and Wicklow ETB. The third school, in Clonburris/ Lucan, will operate under the patronage of the Dublin & Dun Laoghaire Education and Training Board in partnership with Educate Together.

Kildare and Wicklow ETB is sole patron of 6 schools in neighbouring feeder areas and joint patron of 2 others. Educate Together is not the patron of any school in neighbouring feeder areas.

Primary School Details Celbridge Feeder Area:

Six of the schools have a Catholic ethos, 1 school has a Church of Ireland ethos, and 1 school has a Multi Denominational ethos. All 8 schools are teaching through the medium of English.

Post-Primary School Details – Post-Primary Feeder Areas Adjoining Celbridge Feeder Area

Are there post-primary schools of the same or similar patronage in neighbouring catchment areas?

The Celbridge feeder area is bounded by 7 feeder areas namely:

Kilcock, Maynooth, Leixlip, Lucan, Newcastle/Rathcoole, Naas and Prosperous/Clane (see map attached). All have seen increases in post-primary enrolments in recent years.

There are currently 18 post-primary schools in the neighbouring feeder areas and 3 more post-primary schools are due to open in September 2014 – one in Maynooth, one in Naas and one in Lucan/Clonburris, (a total of 21 schools).

- 12 schools, one of which is fee-charging, have a Catholic ethos,

- 9 have a multi-denominational ethos. (3 of these are due to open in 2014, 1 in Maynooth and 1 in Naas. Both of these new schools will be under the patronage of Kildare and Wicklow ETB. The third school, in Clonburris/ Lucan, will operate under the patronage of the Dublin & Dun Laoghaire Education and Training Board in partnership with Educate Together).

Has the patron/ prospective patron provided detail on planned mechanisms to ensure that the proposed school will expand to the size range of 800 to 1,000 pupils (or 400 pupils for a Gaelchóláiste), including:

- **planned possible measures if expansion is not happening as fast as planned**
- **planned collaboration with existing second-level schools in the catchment areas**

Educate Together:

This applicant states that if the anticipated growth does not take place in the planned time frame, it will work with the school, other schools and patrons and the Department while also considering measures such as the review of the enrolment policy and procedures, review of any catchment area regulations, outreach campaigns to raise awareness of the schools and the review of school communications to ensure that there are high levels of understanding of the school in the community. Educate Together has stated its commitment to the maximum use of State resources in education and if the other measures still leave under-utilised space in the school, Educate Together will actively pursue steps such as those envisaged in the “Shared Usage” clause in the standard lease and work with local educational interests and the Department to address the issue.

Educate Together states that it has been a patron of primary schools in Kildare since 2003 and has developed excellent relationships with all second level schools in the area during this time. It maintains that partnership and community involvement area at the core of Educate Together’s ethos and that it supports all of its schools to engage positively and constructively with schools and other organisations in its communities. It states that many of its schools share resources, facilities and staff with neighbouring schools of different types and collaborate on regular or occasional activities and projects. It states that it looks forward to collaborating closely with schools and other organisations in Celbridge and the surrounding areas to ensure that the widest possible range of educational provision can be provided in a coordinated manner for all families in the area and the wider community.

Kildare and Wicklow ETB:

This applicant states that it proposes to offer a broad curriculum to the students in the proposed new school from the outset. It states that other schools under its patronage will be available to share facilities should the need arise in the start- up phase. It states its willingness to share school buildings with other schools as may be determined by the Department should the school building not be at capacity. However, the applicant does not comment specifically on measures to ensure that the school will grow to 1000 pupils.

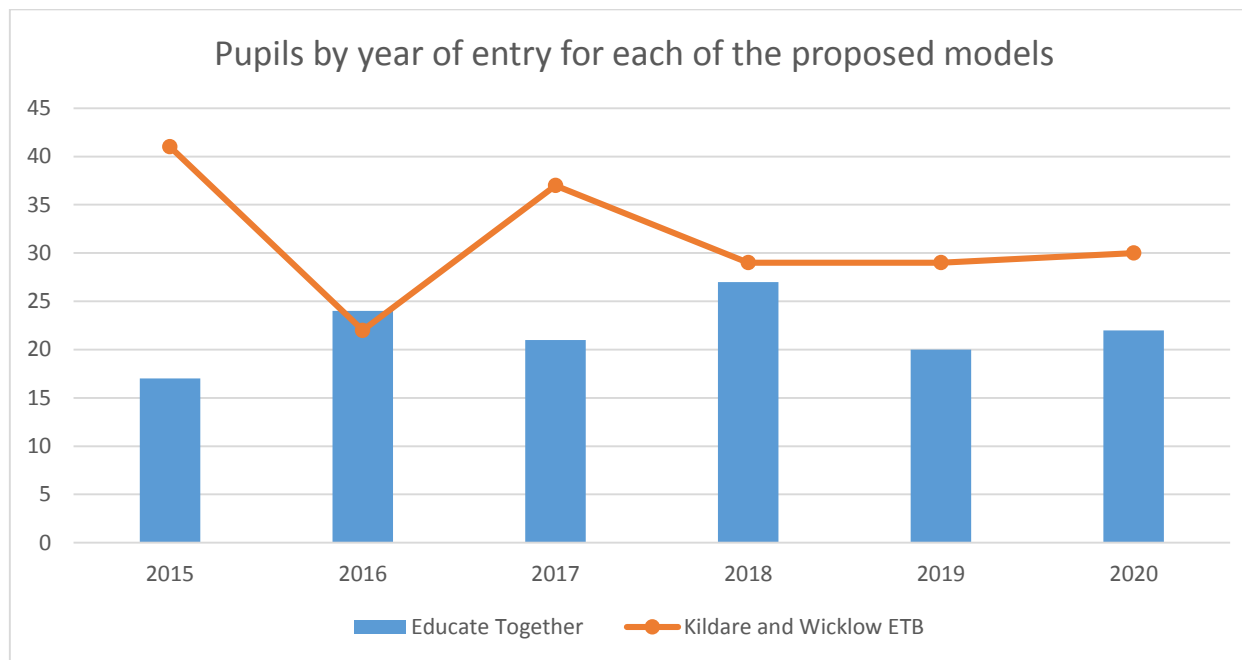

4. Conclusions

Based on an assessment of the applications received, confirmation of compliance with the criteria, assessment of existing school provision and how the proposed school would result in greater diversity, and taking into account parental demand make a recommendation on patronage for the proposed new school in the area.

- The parental demand for each model is reasonably strong though the parental demand for the Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board is stronger than that for the Educate model (with the exception of 2016) both at the commencement of the new school and in succeeding years. Either level of parental demand presented is likely to result in a viable school.
- The model proposed by the applicants separately would provide for greater diversity of provision in the feeder area.
- The applicants have applied for a joint model of patronage but have not agreed the model or obtained parental support for this development. Where an Education and Training Board joins with another national patron body, such as Educate Together, the resulting school model is required to be of a community school type. If the parties proceed with this model, this would provide greater diversity in the feeder area.
- Taking the separate parental demand presented by both applicants together, a potentially strong viable school emerges.
- Given the relative closeness in terms of parental preference numbers, a significant level of unmet demand would occur either way if a decision on patronage was taken in favour of one applicant over another.

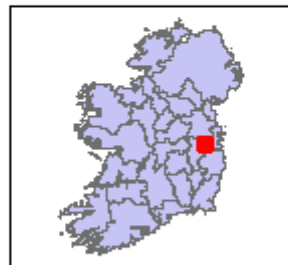
5. Recommendation

The Department recommends that, before a decision on patronage for the new post-primary school for Celbridge is taken, both prospective patrons should be asked to confirm that the parental preferences presented by them with their individual applications may, following consultation with parents on an agreed model of patronage, be amalgamated to support their joint application.

In the event of sufficient parental support being demonstrated for a viable school under the joint patronage model proposed, the Department recommends that approval for patronage be awarded jointly to Educate Together and the Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board.
